	would entail work related to our new collaborate CHIP	
	and will include real 'retreat' sort of activities (beach	
	walk, fun activities, etc).	
	Laura mentioned that 960 people have received ACE	
	training in Coos & Curry Counties!	



	Connie Atwood asked how the current ACE trainings are being used in the community. It was mentioned that standing meetings at DHS as well as multiple school districts, CASA volunteers, and foster parents have taken place. We also have upcoming film nights being scheduled to show the film 'Resilience' and eventually 'Paper Tigers' will be shown in both Coos & Curry Counties. Jeremy Skinner mentioned that there will be various ways for us to partner with the Library in our work related to the ACEs and other community programs, Parent Cafés,	
	etc. Beth Beasley provided updates regarding upcoming youth events that Curry Community Health will be hosting. These events include: - Art in the Park - Family Camp (Strengthening Families), Facilitated by Curry Community Health	
7.0 Curry Community Health	CCH will also be piloting a yoga class for three months, beginning on July 26, 2018 for patients who are experiencing chronic pain. The instructor will be Christine Good from Brookings Harbor Physical Therapy, who is a trauma-informed yoga instructor.	
	CCH will also be hosting a Mental Health First Aid class on July 27, 2018 at the Pacific Reef Hotel, which will be free to the public.
