	Lisa Hendricks has been working diligently on the annual Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) Progress Report highlighting the work of the CHIP subcommittees for the past year. The Chairs of each subcommittee gave a brief report of the past year's work:	Accepted		
	Access to Care CHIP Subcommittee Laura Williams shared that the focus of the committee for the past year has been the Patient Centered Primary Care Home (PCPCH) Learning Collaborative. All clinics participating in the learning collaborative achieved 2017 recognition and have now set goals for 2019/2020. Amanda McCarthy, the Chair of the learning collaborative, has plans to incorporate monitoring activities in to the work of the collaborative this year.			
COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT	<u>Commercial Tobacco Prevention CHIP Subcommittee</u> : Katrinka McReynolds gave an update: They are doing a readiness assessment to decrease the number of youth smokers. Seven people were trained for NOT (Not On Tobacco) training.			
PLAN (CHIP) PROGRESS REPORT	Healthy Eating Active Living (HEAL) CHIP Subcommittee: The committee voted to use our remaining 2017 grant and sponsorship funds to pay printing cost for our enrolled Healthy Bytes partners through the end of the pilot year (Sept. 2018). HEAL, Advanced Health and Pac West have joined forces to get Healthy Bytes Initiative (HBI) material printed into the Thrive section of The World Newspaper each month. HBI monthly food posters are being printed onto banner fabric for display in outdoor venues. HBI now has an online enrollment form to make it easier for Shena Holliday, the project coordinator, to track partners.			
	Suicide Prevention CHIP Subcommittee: Eric Gleason gave an update: The committee got two new members from the VA. THE ARK PROJECT	Melinda Torres from The Ark Project came and gave an overview about what happens at her facility. The Ark Project has been going for seven years. They serve all of Coos County, youth up to 21 years old and their families. They are able to help with hygiene products, bedding, tents, tarps, some food, they also have a clothes closet. They can help pay for birth certificates, driving permits and licenses. Their school hours are Monday through Thursday 1 – 5 pm. Summer hours are Tuesdays 1- 5, Madison Elementary 11:30 – 1pm. From July 2015 to present, they have made 800 contacts at the school location.
