<p><b>COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT PLAN (CHIP) CHARTER</b></p>	<p>Laura Williams presented the draft of the Curry County Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) Charter. We did not have enough time at our last meeting to review it. <p><b>COMMUNITY HEALTH ASSESSMENT (CHA) AND COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT PLAN (CHIP) UPDATES</b></p>	<p><u>Community Health Assessment (CHA)</u>          Laura Williams reported that the CHA work group is currently reviewing the 1<sup>st</sup> draft of the community health assessment and will be submitting edits to our consultant, Vanessa Becker, by 4/02/2018. Vanessa will then send us the 2<sup>nd</sup> draft of the CHA. Laura will email the CAC members the 2<sup>nd</sup> draft for your review. The 3<sup>rd</sup> draft of the CHA will be the final draft that we will review for approval. Once the CAC approves the CHA, we will send it to the Advanced Health Board for final approval.</p> <p><u>CHIP Updates</u></p> <p>Communications, Benefits, Transportation CHIP – Laura Williams shared that the group is reviewing the latest update of the Advanced Health Member Handbook. Also, Laura shared that 211info asked to do a webinar on how to use their services for the Curry CAC. Discussion was had, and the CAC members decided that they did not think this was a good time for a webinar from 211info.</p> <p>Prevention Services CHIP – Dori Statton announced that the Curry Community Health Advisory Board met in February and will meet again in Gold Beach at the Blue Room in April. Dori shared that the Peer Advisory Council (PAC) meets the 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of each month at 11:45 am in the Allcare offices in Brookings. These meetings are open to the public.</p> <p>Gordon Clay shared that he has found a way to compare (and show trends) the Healthy Teen Survey results with the Wellness Survey results. Gordon reported that</p>		

	<p>hopelessness, suicidality, and suicide attempts have gone up in 8<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> graders every year in Oregon since 2009. In the past two years, in Curry County, the suicide attempts have gone down. The Early Learning Division released the 2017-2018 preliminary kindergarten assessment results that show correlation with 3<sup>rd</sup> grade skills. This year, for the first time, there is a group of students who have taken both the kindergarten assessment and the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade assessment. Although there is only one year of data, the results confirm that if we can support children to be ready for success when they enter kindergarten, they are more likely to be on track in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. She brought some to share with Alice Taylor (Maggie will bring them to Alice) as Alice is leading the One Key Question effort in Curry County. Laura stated that the resources in the pamphlet are based in Coos County, but that the pamphlet could be modified for Curry County. Kate Frame shared that she has been focused on networking and developing a work plan in her new role as the Prescription Drug Overdose Prevention Coordinator at Advanced Health.</p>		
<p><b>OPEN DISCUSSION</b></p>	<p>Heidi Hill announced that Advantage Dental has completed their merger with DentaQuest. They have a new CEO who is focused on building robust dental clinics in hopes of improving access to care. Advantage Dental is rolling out their medical model, bringing silver nitrate to the coast. Advantage Dental hygienists have been traveling to all schools on the coast.</p> <p>Beth Barker Hidalgo shared that the Curry County Homeless Coalition hosted a community meeting last night that was focused on north county homeless. Their next meeting is April 12<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm at the Port Orford Library where they will explore similar programs to The Nancy Devereux Center/warming shelter in Coos Bay and how feasible it would be to start in Curry County.</p>
