Questions for CACs:

- 1. Should CCOs annually review member data and align with CAC representation, and report on it? (This may mean, for ex., that the CAC members equal the race/ethnicity, age and geography of the entire CCO membership- if 50% of a CCO's members are male, the CAC should be 50% male too.)
- **Sharon said she thought there should be a review every other year rather than annually.
- Require CCOs share with OHA a clear organizational structure that shows how the CAC connects to the CCO. (Connie recommends that OHA has a CAC board representing all of the state's CCO and Dori suggests that in addition to an org structure, that there also be a communication flow chart).
- 3. Require CCOs to spend money on Social

	**Ben noted that CCH is hosting a Living Well with Chronic Illness class hosted by CCH. 4. Require CCOs to develop shared CHAs with local public health authorities and non-profit hospitals; also encourage shared CHIPs to the extent feasible. (Lennae suggests that they also include FQHCs) 5. Require that CHPs align with 1-2 State Health Improvement Plan (SHIP) priorities, i.e. tobacco cessation, chronic disease control.	
	Belle and her counterparts are collecting all of this data from the various CAC meetings they are attending and will submit to the state and discuss.	
7.0 Advanced Health updates	 Curry AH provided funds for BLS and CPR classes for Curry General hospital We convened our case management meeting with LINCARE presenting their DME referral process. Maggie did a presentation to a group of pregnant mamas at Brighteyes on the dangers to smoking Jesse has been distributing our new Active living program 	
	Laura- gave an update on the status of AH updating the CHIP- possibly hiring a consultant to do that (Vanessa Becker). Lisa- has been working on updating a CHIP progress report and will send it out via email and hard copy.	

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	Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACS)- much work is being done with this- ACE Master Trainers meet monthly, ACE Metrix Committee, ACE Planning Committee and ACE Communications Committee have formed. ACE trainings are free to the public and we're encouraging CAC members to seek out groups/work places/faith-based groups etc for where to present. The Planning Committee has decided to get licenses to show both <i>Resilience</i> and <i>Paper Tigers</i> . Belle noted that by showing the movies, it helps to bring in more community members and aligns well with public ACE trainings. Laura mentioned that we will be bringing 'Parent Cafés' or 'Community Cafés' to the community.	
	Lennae mentioned that AH sponsored Community Health Workers to attend training at the SWOCC campus and online (sponsored some CAC members to attend)- Lennae is teaching the training.	
Other updates	Gordon Clay gave an update on Suicide Watch and the upcoming ASIST training in May- they are trying to get more registrations for the training.
