1.0 Call to Order	The meeting was called to order by Anna Marie Slate at 12:05 pm.						
2.0 Past Meeting Minutes	The CAC meeting minutes of 04/06/17 were reviewed. Melissa Cribbins moved to approve the minutes as written. Corey Wampler seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.	Approved					
3.0 Community Health Improvement Plan – Progress Report, 2016 - 2017	Lisa explained that WOAH is required by the OHA to produce and submit an annual progress report on the Community Health Improvement Plan initiatives. Lisa reviewed the format of the report with the committee and asked each Chair of the Subcommittees to provide an overview of the work of the subcommittee. **Access to Healthcare** Laura Williams explained that the Access to Healthcare Subcommittee established a Primary Care Patient Centered Home (PCPCH) Learning Collaborative that includes representatives from all PCPCH recognized clinics in Coos and Curry County. PCPCH has several standards that focus on access (i.e. in-person access, after-hours access, clinical advice by phone, same day appointments, timely prescription fills, etc.). The goals of the Learning Collaborative are to support all clinics in going through the 2017 site visit as well as continue to work with clinics to achieve a higher-level recognition. Discussion was had around PCPCH recognition and what the consumer would see and expect when going to a PCPCH recognized clinic (i.e. should they have different expectations when going to a level 3 clinic versus level 5 clinic?). Belle offered to reach out to the State PCPCH office to gather more information. **Healthy Eating Active Living (HEAL)** Florence Pourtal-Stevens reported that although our Blue Zones application was not selected as the second demonstration site in Oregon, the HEAL subcommittee is committed to continuing to focus on work that aligns with Blue Zones and is currently developing strategies for community education. The HEAL subcommittee continues to support the development of the Johnson Mill Pond trail and Connect the Boardwalks. Kathy Barber indicated a possible connection with the HEAL subcommittee on her stroller walking program. 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has been focused on decreasing commercial tobacco initiation and use in 12 – 17-year-olds. Fauna reported that the subcommittee recently completed a Community Readiness Assessment that indicated our community is not ready at this time to address tobacco initiation and use in 12-17 - year-olds. Most respondents had little knowledge of what was currently occurring to address tobacco use in this age range. Most respondents indicated the topic was important, but felt this community had "bigger fires" to put out.

Discussion was had regarding marijuana use and the epidemic of opioid and heroin use in our community.

Bob Lieberman provided some information about the Self-Healing Community Initiative that Rogue Valley has implemented and the success that has come out of that.

Fauna indicated the next steps include looking at "Positive Cultural Norms" which Cynthia Edwards has researched and recommended. The subcommittee is considering a pilot program around this type of effort.

Mental Health

The Coos Drop is very close to holding their Grand Opening (June). This has been a main focus of the Mental Health Subcommittee – from researching Youth Move program implementation steps in Oregon, assessing the feasibility of one in Coos County, finding a location, developing a Youth Leadership Coalition, determining funding, and opening the center.

Another project of the subcommittee is putting call boxes on the McCullough Bridge. They have finalized the call box and sign designs. They submitted their plan to the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) for their review and received approval.

They have also been working on publicizing suicide resources and promoting and conducting Youth Mental Health First Aid trainings. Recently, the Oregon legislature required all youth suicides to be reported to the county, so they county will now know.

The subcommittee also has a focus on the Veteran population.

Maternal and Child Health

Florence Pourtal-Stevens reported that they have implemented the One Key Question (OKQ) in two medical offices and at the county health department. The OKQ is "Do you want to become

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	pregnant in the next year?" They have researched the feasibility of changing some E.H.R. forms to help workflow. They have conducted trainings with the pilot providers and have evaluated the pilot program. This committee received a CAC mini grant to develop and print a resource booklet specifically designed for use with the OKQ. They are currently developing the resource booklet.
