Bonnie Ell announced that a new CAC membership application has been drafted and is available for current and new members to complete. Laura Williams spoke to the requirements of CAC membership and explained how the ratios of consumer membership vs. non-members works and what the requirements of the CAC Charter are. Laura also mentioned that we are in need of a city council member or official and would like to diversify our CAC in general. Sharon Daymond stated that she would like to expand CAC membership to non-Advanced Health consumers (of AllCare, Medicaid, or other) and also suggested hosting meetings in Brookings if that will help bring in more members. Dori Statton wants to expand membership to former Advanced Health members from the past 2 years. Belle Sheperd mentioned that there are no OHA
