4.0 Advanced Health Chief Medical Officer	Dr. Kent Sharman introduced himself as Advanced Health's Chief Medical Officer (part time) and spoke about his work in provider recruitment to rural areas in Oregon, and mentioned he been involved in the Oregon Health Plan since the 1990s.  Dr. Sharman mentioned that there are uncertainties as to whether or not OHP will survive CCO 2.0. He mentioned that the heavy lifts required in the policies and procedures processes are daunting and effect those who went into medicine to help people and provide services.  He mentioned that we are aware of the areas that are not working as efficiently as they could-communication, transportation with BCB, etc but that right now, Advanced Health is in the process of writing new policies and procedures and are working to make things easier and better.  Bonnie Ell asked for him to speak a bit more in regards to the fears or concerns of OHP making it through CCO 2.0. Dr. Sharman spoke to the	



	changes there are currently being made with behavioral health and the shortages of providers (shortage of 40,000 MDDOs nationwide). He said that if we can keep our provider networks intact, he believes we'll be fine and weather the changes.  Hollie Strahm asked for him to speak to oral health-Dr. Sharman stated that he is more familiar with oral health in Coos Bay- but that through the new measures (kindergarten readiness and diabetes screening) there will be ways to help better address oral health needs.	
	Ben Cannon asked if we (in rural areas) are being heard (from Portland- state level). Dr. Sharman responded that no- we are not- but that we have staff at Advanced Health active at the state level to advocate on our behalf for rural communities and vulnerable Oregonians.

Bonnie Ell mentioned that a Regional Health Equity Coalition is forming and to let her know if anyone is interested in joining.
