(yes, we listen!):</p> <p>The Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission was charged by the Oregon legislature with developing a statewide strategic plan to identify priorities for substance misuse prevention and intervention and substance use disorder treatment and recovery. 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	<p>Health Evidence Review Commission (HERC): To get updated information, see items open for comment or topics for future review: https://www.oregon.gov/oha/hpa/dsi-herc/pages/index.aspx</p> <p>The HERC met on May 16th and voted unanimously to remove requirements for opioid tapering if not clinically indicated from the OHP guidelines for neck and back pain treatment coverage. The change will be effective October 1, 2019. Previously in 2016 the HERC expanded OHP coverage for neck and back pain, newly approving non-pharmacological services such as physical and occupational therapy, chiropractic care, cognitive behavioral therapy, acupuncture and yoga. The benefit package had also required opioid tapering neck and back pain patients from long-term opioid therapy. The HERC also voted to decline to cover opioid treatment for the five chronic pain conditions that had been under consideration since 2017, citing a lack of clinical effectiveness. The 5 conditions were: chronic pain due to trauma, post-procedural chronic pain, chronic pain syndrome, other chronic pain, and fibromyalgia.</p> <p>OHA released the 2018 CCO Metrics Deeper Dive report with a focus on Emergency department utilization for physical health reasons among members with mental illness. The report considers the data on a few measures related to members with specific mental health diagnoses to help develop a better understanding of potential drivers of quality improvement, and suggest areas where further focus could be targeted for</p>

<p>4.0 Advanced Health updates</p>	<p>Updates from Curry County:</p> <p>Bonnie Ell introduced Katy Halverson, Advanced Health’s new Director of Behavioral Health. Katy introduced herself and shared her education and background and that she hopes to help improve access to behavioral health providers.</p> <p>Laura Williams provided an overview of the new Curry Community Health Improvement (CHIP) and highlighted the ‘big rock’ priority areas that have been outlined in the plan- Health Systems & Capacity, Health Equity, and Communities & Families, with an emphasis on access to improved behavioral health and addictions services. Laura mentioned that as a collaborative CHIP, we will be partnering with the AllCare Health to form a collaborative regional CAC to move forward with the new CHIP.</p> <p>Connie Atwood made a motion to approve the new CHIP. Alice Taylor seconded it, Sharon Daymond disapproved, but the motion passed.</p> <p>Bonnie Ell provided an update on the latest community outreach events hosted by South Coast Together, ‘Paper Tigers’ film night and two Family Cafes. Bonnie mentioned that the Family Cafes hosted in Brookings were a great success and helped to connect other grandparents who are raising their grandchildren. The grandparents will continue to meet monthly for a coffee hour</p>		



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	<p>on the 2nd Tuesday of the month at the Bell & Whistle coffee shop located in the Smoke House.</p> <p>Laura Williams announced that on Sept. 7, 2019 at 9 am, an Out of the Darkness walk will be hosted in Coos Bay, and we are invited to attend. Laura also mentioned that Curry County could try to host a similar walk and/or awareness event.</p> <p>Bonnie announced that Every Child Curry County, which will receive funding from Advanced Health, is moving forward with their partnership with United Way as the local non-profit backbone. Bonnie introduced Christina Karsen Gray, who works for DHS and is filling a new role as a liaison between DHS and Every Child. Ultimately, her goal is to better support existing foster families and bring on new families.</p>
