If this is not the case, they should call the 800 number (1-888-468-0022) and register a complaint or call our member services and register the complaint there.	
	Maggie did orientation training with a new PCP, Dr. Hal Lowry, who will begin seeing patients in Port Orford in January at the Coast Community Health Center. The pharmacy is now open and the Outreach office has moved in as well.	
3.0 Traditional Healthcare	Oasis Shelter Home- shelter has gone through a makeover in 2019- they offer tours. Community partners adopted rooms and made them beautiful. They also started a new rental assistance programs as well as Advocacy programs. They have also begun a Youth Survivors Support group and GED group.	
Worker	United Way of Southwestern Oregon- Jen Shafer promoted their 'Day of Caring' where they help people with yard work who are unable to do so themselves. They also have a Coats & Shoes program where they delivered 373 items, including some to Riley Creek.

<b>SCBEC</b> - Mellissah Hendrickson- 5 full ride scholarships for the Truck Driver program, 2 CNA scholarships and they introduced their in-school youth program and SCBEC expanded to 6 counties added 2 jobs in Curry County. Assisted over 70 people in finding full time positions.	
<b>OHA</b> - Belle Sheperd reported on the December OHA report- see notes below.	
<b>Connie Atwood</b> - reported on how proud she is of the accomplishments Advanced Health made to reach CCO 2.0 requirements and reported on being grateful to be part of the Every Child Curry program that formed this year, which supports foster families and DHS.	
<b>Beth Barker-Hidalgo</b> - reported on the great work of United Way of Southwestern Oregon and how their work aligns so well with the efforts of the CACs. She also mentioned the Empty Bowls fundraiser which will help to benefit food security for the County. She is also proud of the Resource Center and how many people they've been able to serve in 2019 since opening. Beth also mentioned that the Poverty Simulation training is coming to Curry in 2020.	
<b>Connie Hunter</b> - expressed gratitude to be part of the Curry CAC and to everyone for their hard work. She also noted the work that has been done to support Veterans and to support them in the opioid epidemic.

	<b>Michelle Hanna</b> - Reported on the new pharmacy through Coast Community Health and Outreach walk- in services in Port Orford in the Auburn Center. Providers will be coming in	
	<b>Wendy Lang</b> - Juvenile Department noted that the focus has been on South County and youth in crisis down there. They are also seeing 9-12 year olds unfortunately with drug and alcohol abuse. They are working on teaching youth skills now vs just picking up trash along the highways.	
	<b>Gordon Clay</b> - Thanked the CAC for their support and for the work they are doing in the County. Gordon reported he has 163 locations where he has the 'Are You Okay?' cards available and has replaced over 1,000 cards! Gordon noted that over the Suicide Prevention Magazine, which was supported by Advanced Health and AllCare and then supported by 43 businesses and organizations and 44 individuals who donated \$50 each. Gordon has also started the Suicide Prevention Council, which has now been approved by the Board of Curry County Commissioners- now there are 17 open positions which need to be filled by stakeholders. Gordon is asking the CAC and guests to apply. The first meeting will be held on Wed., February 5 <sup>th</sup> at 5 pm. <b>Lualhati Anderson</b> - Older Adult Behavioral Health
