Coos County Community Health Improvement Plan ( CHIP )	Laura Williams presented the Coos County Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP), 2019-2022. She reviewed the document with the committee focusing on the top priority areas and high-level strategies: 1. Individuals and Families • Adversity, Trauma, and Toxic Stress • Prevention 2. Health equity • Housing & Homelessness • Food & Nutrition • Transportation • Economic Stability 3. Access and Capacity • Access & Integration of Services • Behavioral Health & Addictions 4. Community Outreach and Engagement • Coordination, collaboration, and communication Discussion was had regarding the process of developing the improvement plan as well as how we will define specific goals and objectives. The CHIP work team members explained that we are in the process of defining and developing the governance structure of the CHIP. Once workgroups consisting of content experts begin to meet, they will be able to create specific goals			



	and objectives for each strategy. Progress on the goals

	Health Evidence Review Commission (HERC): to get updated information, see items open for comment or topics for future review: https://www.ore- gon.gov/oha/hpa/dsiherc/pages/index.aspx The HERC met on May 16 <sup>th</sup> and voted unanimously to remove requirements for opioid tapering if not clinically indicated from the OHP guidelines for neck and back pain treatment coverage. The change will be effective Oct. 1, 2019 . Previously in 2016 the HERC expanded OHP coverage for neck and back pain, newly approving non-pharmacological services such as physical and oc- cupational therapy, chiropractic care, cognitive behav- ioral therapy, acupuncture and yoga. The benefit pack- age had also required opioid tapering neck and back pain patients from long-term opioid therapy. The HERC also voted to decline to cover opioid treatment for the five chronic pain conditions tat had been under consid- eration since 2017, citing a lack of clinical effectiveness. The 5 conditions were : chronic pain syndrome, other chronic pain, an fibromyalgia OHA released the 2018 CCO Metrics Deeper Dive re- port with a focus on Emergency department utilization for physical health reasons among members with men- tal illness. The report considers the data on a few measures related to members with specific mental health diagnoses to help develop a better understand- ing of potential drivers of quality improvement, and sug- gest areas where further focus could be targeted for im- provements.
