Update from the Oregon Health authority (OHA)	REPORTS and NEWS: 1. Oregon Health Policy Board (OHPB) Health Equity Committee (HEC) adopted an agency wide Health Equity Definition. The definition can be further explained on the HEC presentation to OHPB from October 2019, found at: https://www.ore-gon.gov/oha/OEI/Pages/Health-Equity-Committee.aspx The definition: Oregon will have established a health system that creates health equity when all people can reach their full health potential and well-being and are not disadvantaged by their race, ethnicity, language, disability, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, social class, intersections among these communities or identities, or other socially determined circumstances. Achieving health equity requires the ongoing collaborations of all regions and sectors of the state, including tribal governments to address: The equitable distribution or redistribution of resources and power; and Recognizing, reconciling and rectifying historical and contemporary injustices. 2.
