The Primary Care Payment Reform Collaborative (PCPRC) advises to the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) on how to improve the ways primary care clinics are reimbursed, and invest in primary care without increasing costs. The group is led by the OHA Transformation Center and meets four times per year. Participants include staff from CCOs, commercial health plans, health associations, as well as health care providers. The Transformation Center believes strongly in giving voice to consumers and is looking to fill two consumer seats on the collaborative for this purpose.

Responsibilities

- 1. From a consumer/patient perspective, provide feedback to the collaborative about its recommendations.
- 2. Feedback can be provided at meetings (currently held via Zoom), in writing or over the phone to OHA staff.

4.0 Advanced Health Updates & presentatio n	Bonnie Ell reminded everyone that Advanced Health is still recruiting more consumer members to join the Curry CAC and to help spread the word, and also that the Curry Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) coalition meets the 1 st Wednesday of the month via Zoom from 2-4 pm and to contact bonnie.ell@advancedhealth.com for the login. Bonnie also showed the Community Advisory Council (CAC) 101 presentation recorded by Tom Cogswell of the Oregon Health Authority (OHA). 6.0 Community Partner Updates	Beth Barker-Hidalgo mentioned that the Curry Homeless Coalition will be going mobile with a refurbished vehicle until their transitional housing and new resource center is up and running- hopefully mid spring 2021. Beth also expressed concerns for the high fees Curry Health Network (CHN) will need to be paying as a result of tending recurring visits from the unhoused community and is urging CHN to consider finding a way to provide fowl weather shelter. Elaine Lortscher expressed her concerns for the community at large not wearing masks correctly and requested that we help to get information out to the public about proper use. Nat Jacobs included links in the Zoom chat- attached in supporting documents- that can be used to share with community partners and on social media. Mellissah Hendrickson spoke to concerns about the delayed time in community members with flu-like symptoms being able to get tested. She knows of a case where even with doctor's orders, the patient had to wait at least 48 hours for testing. Corrine Potts mentioned that Curry County only has a Census response rate of 48%, which will effect funding.
