CALL TO ORDER	The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Ruby Phillips at 12:03 pm. Introductions were made. Laura Williams welcomed Jim Gardner, Advanced Health's new Chief Operating Officer.			
COUNCIL BUSINESS	 2021 Oregon Health Authority (OHA) Transformation Center CAC Conference Laura Williams reported that OHA plans to hold their annual CAC Conference virtually this year due to the Covid 19 pandemic. This will be a multi-day conference. The dates have not yet been set, but they are looking in April or May. Laura asked the council for input on how we could accommodate CAC members that want to participate in the conference but do not have access to the internet. Lisa DeSalvio recommended providing hotspots and chromebooks, or limited in-person; Dale Hodges suggested limited in-person with a large, wide screen TV; Ruby Phillips shared that the library has computers available as well as large meeting rooms with internet access and large screen. 			



CAC Charter Laura Williams distributed the revised Coos CAC Charter for members to review. We will plan to finalize and approve the Charter at an upcoming meeting. Non- COVID-19 News:

Oregon Health Authority (OHA) has received a planning grant to prepare for implementation of the National Suicide Prevention Help Line which will go into effect in July of 2022. When fully activated, anyone in the United States can call 988 to reach someone for support. SHARE (Supporting Health for All through Reinvestment) was created by the Legislature in 2018. The SHARE Initiative comes from a legislative requirement for coordinated care organizations (CCOs) to invest some of their profits back into their communities. After meeting minimum financial standards, CCOs must spend a portion of their net income or reserves on services to address health inequities and the social determinants of health and equity (SDOH-E) By June 30th of 2021, CCOs are required to submit their first annual SHARE spending plan on how they will use their funds to meet the SHARE requirements.

SHARE investments must align with the CCOs Community Health Improvement Plan and engage partners who are also working on SDOH at the community level. Read more about SHARE here:

The Oregon Legislative Session has started. Nearly 1,800 bills have been introduced. One of

the bills prioritized by Governor Kate Brown is Cover All People or HB 20164

ced. This bill would provide state **General Fund to allow** adults who are not currently

covered under OHP to gain coverage based on their income.

It is patterned after an earlier legislative action know as Cover All Kids, which now covers children up to the age of 18 based on the income of their families. If approved, Cover All People would get Oregon closer to having 100% of their state population with access to health care coverage.

Coos County gets 200 vaccines at a time and has given out well over 85%. We are around 4-6 months out for the general population to receive vaccinations at this time. Katrinka McReynolds from Coos Health and Wellness answered many additional questions regarding recent outbreaks.
