PROBLEMS, AREAS/OPPOR TUNITIES FOR IMPROVEMENT	<ul> <li>AH.</li> <li>Penny Peters – member of the AH Intensive Care Coordination (ICC) Team shared the main line number 541-269-7400 and to ask for Joanne Rutland. There are many individuals that are experiencing houselessness and often need follow-up care, especially if they have complex medical stuff. ICC helps build Autonomy and capacity to support individuals to navigate and get consistency in their daily lives.</li> <li>Kera Hood -mental health is a subject discussed often and you can have mental illness and still maintain the majority of your rights until you come in imminent danger to self or others. MRT and Officer Babb are making continual contact with these individuals to convince them to sign up for OHP.</li> <li>Drew farmer express concern over the states overly tight definition of Danger to self.</li> <li>Kera- In a recent listening session with Boomer Wright this was discussed, and he is our line to take our concerns to the State level.</li> <li>David Geels- appreciated what is being discussed and has been in discussion at the state level. Feels that at the state level we are not clear about what direction they want to move forward. we're kind of a rough and tumble state where we want people to do exactly what they want to do when they want to do it, but then the consequences is sometimes we have really ill people out there that we're not able to really help. Laws were written many decades ago and don't really operate well in today's healthcare system.</li> </ul>

	Dale Hodges – would like to know what the AH board where we are in terms of how much of the charter is being fulfilled and what needs to be done. Is there an update or an inventory that we can take in terms of the committees on how effective they have bee, or how we can be more effective in the future. Avery- many things are brought to the council and then brought to the board. Dale- wanted to know if the Charter is equanimous and how it is made Sam- the Charter is voted on every year by the CAC members the next vote will be in June and there is a draft that is being worked on with suggested revisions.	
RECOM MENDATIONS	Stephanie Polizzi – this has been brought up many times – it is really important when we look a health to look upstream for our members about nutrition services. Providers can't address nu- trition as they are not trained in nutrition.	
	Drew Farmer – do we have access to get an advocate in the ER to ensure folks coming into the hospital who have OHP are getting connected with services they are entitled to? Anna- this is something that is being discussed. There is no current navigator. Avery – can we put a sign up? Drew- Many OHP individuals may not / cannot read the sign. Anna- ICC does work with the Emergency Department staff and meet with the hospital staff regularly. There are some indi- viduals that will get an alert to ICC when they come to the ER. The Hospital has staff to help folks who show up in the ER. Dale- can we get the security Guard to help? Drew- a person in uniform with a gun may not be the best per- son to help.

	There is an issue where one of the state systems had about 100 checks that were missing a number on the account. A recent turn over in Essential Services Department – Laura Hunter is the interim director – she has been with ORCCA for about 10 years. ORCCA had some rapid changes in the leadership roles. First goal is to recoalesce the team. Englewood project is a big project currently – they have sub- mitted a plan to install 41 low-income units on the former Eng- lewood site. Have moved itself out of the property side of the transfer but is still engaged in the entire process for long term support.	
OPEN FLOOR – AGENCY MEMBERS & PUBLIC COMMENT	Jen Schafer – United Way foes have some additional COVID response funding available. It is broader than what is has been in the past. Still support urgent and emerging COVID needs PPE, Testing and client support. Also supporting community organizations that are not 501c3 who are in schools or working with volunteers. Stress has been high over the last few years and funding helps give recognition to staff and volunteers as needed and reaching out to all community organizations and frontline workers.
