Dr Emmett is credentialed through AH to provide behavioral health services, he has an interest in Wellness and more in a whole person model. He is credentialed and OHP available with good parity on mental health, behavioral health services.</li> <li>Does the CCO cover yoga, does OHP cover what we would considerate safe, functional, or integrative or complimentary medication, medicine treatments? – the answer is it depends.</li> <li>Yoga for example may not be specifically a covered service by OHP, many CCO's, pre-pandemic, were trying to figure this out as we walk into the endemic movement now may provide a live class or wellness classes.
