- South Coast Regional Early Learning (SCREL)one of 16 early learning hubs in the state. Align services from prenatal to 6-year-old.
- Priority populations
 - o Foster Care, and their families
 - Victims of abuse and neglect
 - Are homeless or have unstable housing
 - Have a disability
 - o English Language Learners
 - Racial and/or ethnic minority status
 - Economically disadvantaged
 - o Pregnant moms and young children, birth to three years old
 - o Infants and toddlers in Geographically Isolated Communities
- ECE Expansion- New website that is family friendly full time navigator that is bilingual.
 - Coordinated enrollment for preschool promise
 - Work with families to find programs that meet needs
 - Coordinate Parent Cafes
- Community investment funds focus areas Invest \$200K a year for services.
 - Family support services
 - o Parent education and engagement
 - Kindergarten transition programs
 - Professional learning teams
- Home visiting systems coordination

OHA updates

- Healthier Oregon. Presentation. HB 3352 expanding Cover All Kids program to include adults, \$100 Million
- Starting July 1, 2022, people 18-25, or 55 and older will be eligible for OHP
- Public health emergency has been extended to July 14, 2022. States will get at least 60 days' notice before it ends.
 - o Redetermination process will begin once Oregon receives the notice.
