YES GOALS

- Availability 24/7 in person response
- Crisis is defined by the Parent/Caregiver
- On Site face to face Therapeutic Response & Telehealth
- Available within 60-Minutes*
- Access to Psychiatric Consultation
- Provide support in Child's Natural Environment
- Provide Peer support as Member of Response Team
- A YES provider will conduct followup 5 days after discharge ensuring the child and their family are successfully transitioned to ongoing services and supports

^{*}The program response of availability within 60-minutes of contact can be telephonic until an in person responder arrives.



QUICK VIEW OF YES

YES is a child and family specific crisis intervention model that recognizes the developmental needs of children and works with the child specific systems that have shared responsibility for children such as schools, courts, child welfare and community supports.

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WHAT IS A CRISIS?

Crisis for youth and and their families can look very different.

It can be defined as "an event or period that will lead to unstable and dangerous situation affecting an individual, group or all of society." All crisis' can look very different.



WHAT WE CAN PROVIDE

- YES is a level of transitionary care for children though the age of 20
- Provide contact with QMHP & Family support specialist within 3 days of recommendation of services
- Provide Skills training, Individual therapy, Family therapy, Medication management, Case Management, Care Coordination, Youth peer support services, Family Support Services, and 24hour crisis response services.
- Incorporate safety and crisis planning.
- Provide up to 56 days of services while transitioning to other treatment providers within the primary insurance network
