OHA: This is set by and decided by the Feds. Each program like		
TANF, SNAP and OHP have their own eligibility guidelines.		
ODHS: People can contact any DHS office. They can get help to		
find out options to keep benefits that apply directly to their		
situation. The income guidelines are set Federally. In October		
of each year there is a update to how allotments are		
calculated. When someone calls or comes in to apply, we run		
them through every program we have and then determine		
what they are eligible for to make sure they are aware of all		
options.		
Community Outreach Coordinator: We encourage you to go to your		
local community partner who helps members sign-up for OHP. They can help a member reapply or apply for the annual income test.		
And this is just a small part of what they can support with.		
Discussion about access to a table of thresholds to help people		
understand the impact of something like a raise if it would trigger		
you losing some state benefits.		
Q: Who would we contact to try to help change this on a		
federal level?		
A: You would want to reach out to your state representative,		
Senators and congress men and women for state set eligibility.		
You could also contact centers for Medicaid and Medicare for		
the federal funding and policy decisions for OHP. It would be		
under the Health and Human services division.
